# A Message from the Board of Education

The Board of Education is pleased to present the proposed 2012-2013 school district budget for your consideration. Our goal again this year was to prepare a budget that meets the educational needs of our students and continues to be cost effective for our taxpayers. This was a unique budget year for our district given the reduction in state aid we expect and the Property Tax Levy Limit imposed this year. We believe we have accomplished our goal in the budget that is being presented for your consideration.

Avoca, like many districts in Steuben County, is heavily dependent upon State Aid in funding education. Approximately 75% of our revenues come to us in the form of State Aid. We will see another decrease in the aid we receive for the 2012-2013 school year, and therefore it was necessary to prepare a spending proposal that includes reductions.

The major reductions will come in different areas of the budget. The first area is staffing. There are three known retirements from our staff at the end of this school year. Two of the three positions will not be filled next year due to budget reductions. The second area where expenditures will be reduced is in programming for occupational and special education students. We have fewer students attending the CTE programs at the Wildwood Education Center amounting to nearly \$100,000 of reduced costs. Additionally, we will be expanding our shared service offerings with the Prattsburgh and Hammondsport School Districts. This endeavor will result in savings to the district of just under \$100,000. The third area where you will see reduced expenditures is in the capital portion of the budget. The payments for the capital project which was approved by the voters in 1999 carried with it payments through the 2019 school year. The bonds became eligible for refinancing this year, and the Board made the prudent decision to do so. The interest rate on the original bond was 4.38% which was a very good rate for 2002. However, interest rates have dropped significantly during the past four years and the district is refinancing the bonds at the rate of 1.83%. This coupled with an early payment on a portion of the principal will save the district more than \$700,000 over the next seven years.

The board and administrators have also settled three contracts with bargaining units under which the employees' share of health insurance payments will be increasing. We have made further cuts across the board in materials and supply budgets as well. The budget being presented for approval represents a total **decrease** of 2.18%. The reductions in proposed expenditures that we have made will allow us to present a budget with a proposed tax levy increase of 1.9%.

We continue with our commitment to provide a quality educational program for our students, yet are mindful of our responsibility to the community for fiscal restraints. Please take a few minutes to review the enclosed material and attend the Public Hearing on Tuesday, May 8th. The Vote will be held on Tuesday, May 15th in the Auditorium Lobby.

Shall the annual budget of the Avoca Central School District for the fiscal year 2012-2013 in the amount of \$11,721,439 be adopted?

#### QUALIFICATIONS OF VOTERS

A person shall be entitled to vote in any school district election and in all matters placed upon the official ballot; and sign a nominating petition if such person is:

a citizen of the United States; at least 18 years old; a resident of the school district for at least 30 days prior to the meeting.

#### **ABSENTEE BALLOTS**

Voters who meet the following criteria need to fill out an Application for Absentee Ballot in order to be eligible to receive an Absentee Ballot. Applications are available in the District Office. Absentee ballots must be provided to any qualified voter who will be unable to vote in person due to:

- illness or physical disability, hospitalization
- 2. incarceration
- 3. travel outside the voter's county or city of residence for employment or business reasons, studies, or vacation on the day of the election

The district clerk must receive applications for an absentee ballot at least seven days before the vote if the ballot is to be mailed to the voter or one day prior to the vote, if in person.

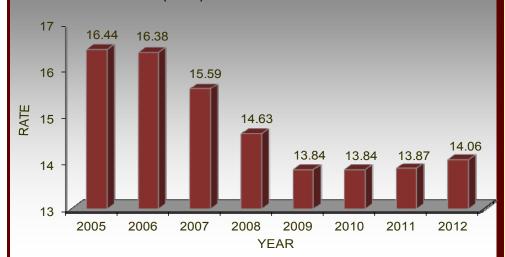

# STAR: SCHOOL TAX RELIEF Basic Star Exemption

The Basic STAR works by exempting the first \$30,000 of the full market value of a home from school taxes.

#### **Enhanced Star Exemption**

The actual tax rate for each township will not be established until this summer. Each year, however, as a comparative analysis, we try to predict what the tax rate might be for a home fully assessed at its True Value. The chart above gives you what the actual tax rate came in at in August. The projected rate for 2011-2012 was \$14.04. In August the rate was set at \$13.87....17¢ less than projected! Using the best information available to us at the present time we believe the full value tax rate will be \$14.06. The actual rate will be based on actual assessed value.

# PROPOSITION #2

That the Board of Education be authorized to expend up to \$150,000 from the existing Transportation Vehicle Replacement Reserve Fund and to authorize the requisite portion thereof to be raised by taxation on the taxable property of the District for the purchase of one (1) school bus; one (1) truck and to expend therefore a gross sum not exceeding \$150,000.

⇒ The vehicles will be paid for with funds currently held in the Transportation Vehicle Reserve Fund. Consequently, the purchase of these items will not have an impact on the budget. One 66 passenger C-2 Freightliner Thomas will replace a 60 passenger C-2 Freightliner Thomas (Bus # 89) and the district will purchase a new 1 ton dump truck with a plow.
