


Which grade band represents your child(ren)?




If you have a child that will be of Kindergarten age this fall, will you be enrolling him/her in the district if students return to school in September?


I believe in-person school should resume as normal, in September, with some new procedures to reduce the spread of the illness.


I believe in-person school should resume in September and face coverings should be worn by staff and students when social distancing is not possible.




If students return to school in September, which measures do you currently believe are MOST important for the district to employ? Please mark all that apply.

I am a single parent. I feel I don't have a choice but to send him to school on opening. I cannot be a stay at home mom and still pay my bills or home school after I get home from work. It is to much stress for him and myself. He will fight wearing a mask but would get used to it .

I am concerned about the quality of the instruction that will be provided to my children. I fear the disruptions and distractions of social distancing, masks, staggered schedules, remote learning and other health precautions may be detrimental to the education that my children are in school to receive. I also understand the necessity of these precautions to protect the health of all those that attend or work in the school district. Educational programs have relied on face-to-face classroom instruction for generations. I am concerned that the fallout from COVID-19 may cause a large scale movement away from traditional instructor-led classrooms. I am also concerned with the virus risks my children will face by being around so many other young children that are still learning the importance of personal hygiene. I am torn between what is best for their education and what is best for their health and safety.

I am concerned that our leaders will gravely misinterpret the guidelines and put the students, faculty, and entire community as a whole in danger. For example, the guidelines state that the best prevention is social distancing and consistent mask wear. Over the summer I have witnessed a member of the administration interacting with construction crews on school grounds where neither party was wearing a mask. If the administrators are refusing to follow protocol and are refusing to enforce protocol on parties that have a significant financial incentive to comply, how are we, the public, expected to have confidence in compliance when the school year begins again?

I am concerned that teachers will refuse to go to school because they fear they are putting their health/the health of students at risk by being there. I think this is a fear that is irrational and not based on the data. I am not any more concerned about students or staff spreading COVID at our school than I am that they will spread the flu. Basic handwashing and some distancing will be enough to slow the spread. I do think masks would be a major distraction and will be a pointless proposition, especially given the mixed data on the effectiveness of the masks. There is much we do not yet understand about SARS-CoV-2. It is currently believed that the virus does not usually (but sometimes does) have a significant impact on children, but the science is not clear on whether or not those children are able to pass the virus to others. While it is easy to dismiss the threat of the disease to children, consideration is not being given to the potential for it to be spread to at-risk categories of citizens, such as older people (grandparent who may be primary care givers) and those who are immuno-compromised. I think that resuming in-school activities without a clearer understanding of this virus is foolish at best, especially considering that some families may travel to and from states with a much higher case load. It would be very easy for the virus to once again establish a foothold in NYS in general, or in our area in particular. Far, far too many people are not taking this pandemic seriously.
